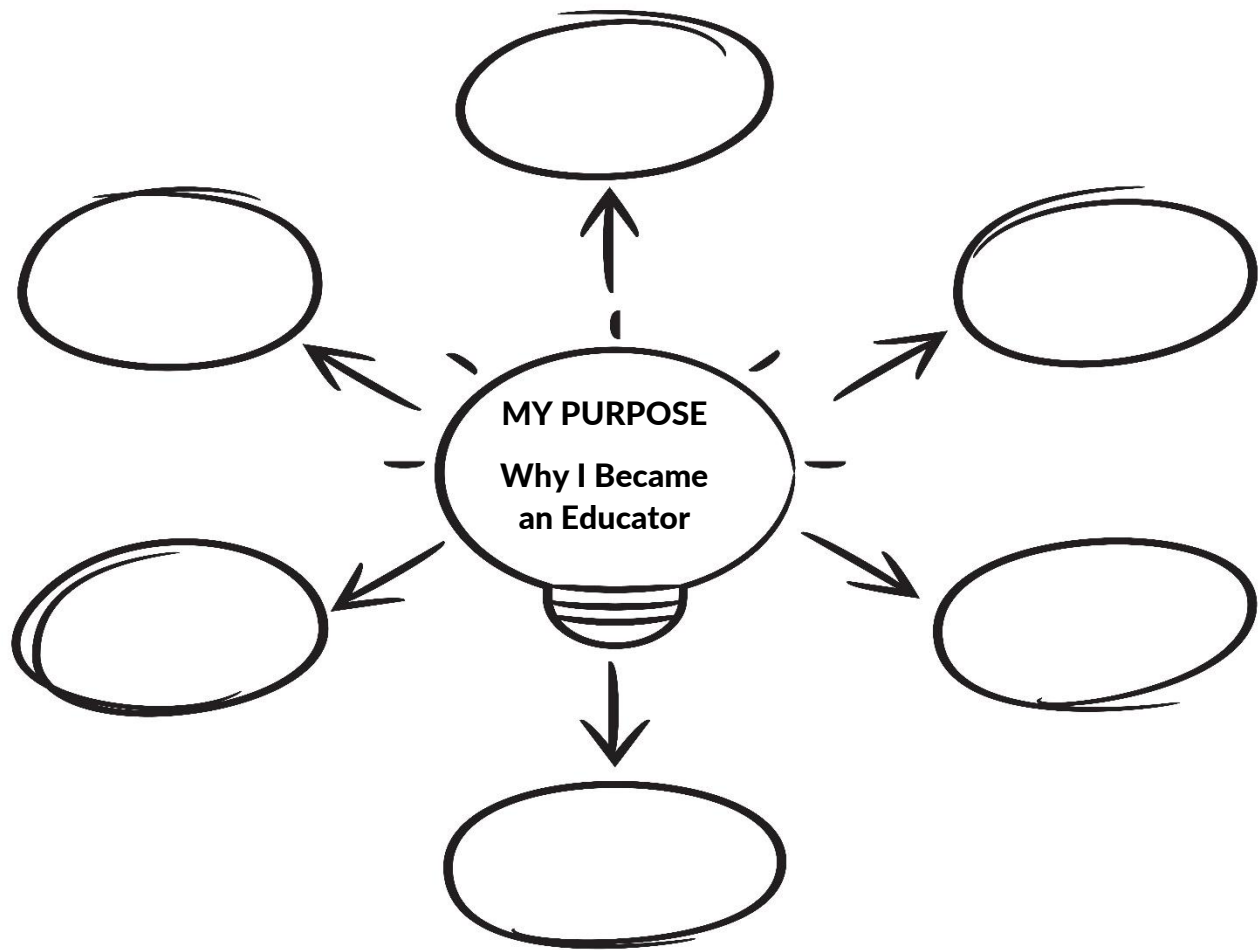


What is Your Purpose for Working with Students?
